The Federal Government will deliver at the End of 2005 all services of the Federal Administration, which could be delivered online.

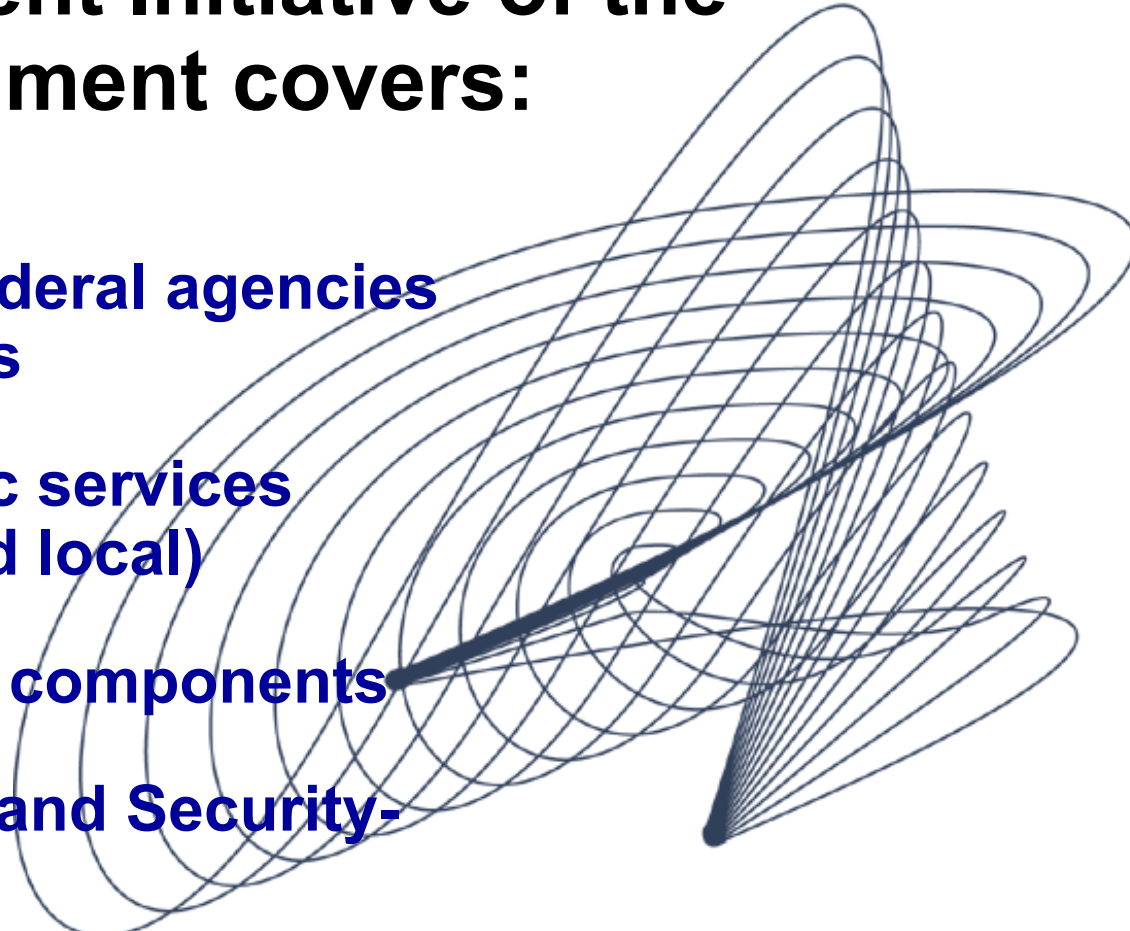

First step: BundOnline 2005

The eGovernment Initiative of the Federal Government covers:

- More than 100 federal agencies and organisations
- Almost 400 public services (federal, state and local)
- Currently 6 basic components
- Communication- and Security-Infrastructures

- **Knowledge-Transfer**



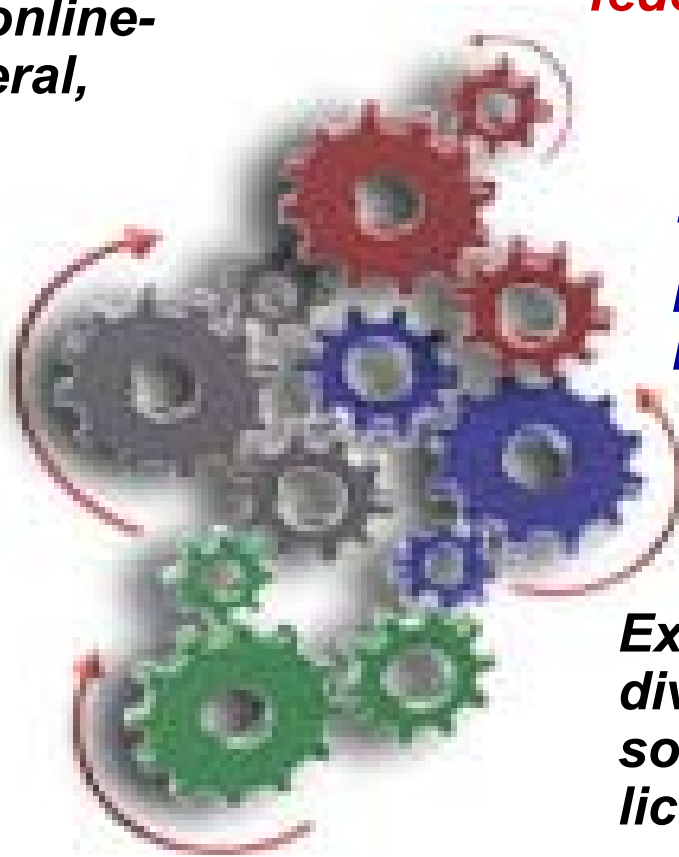

- higher Productivity and Acceptance

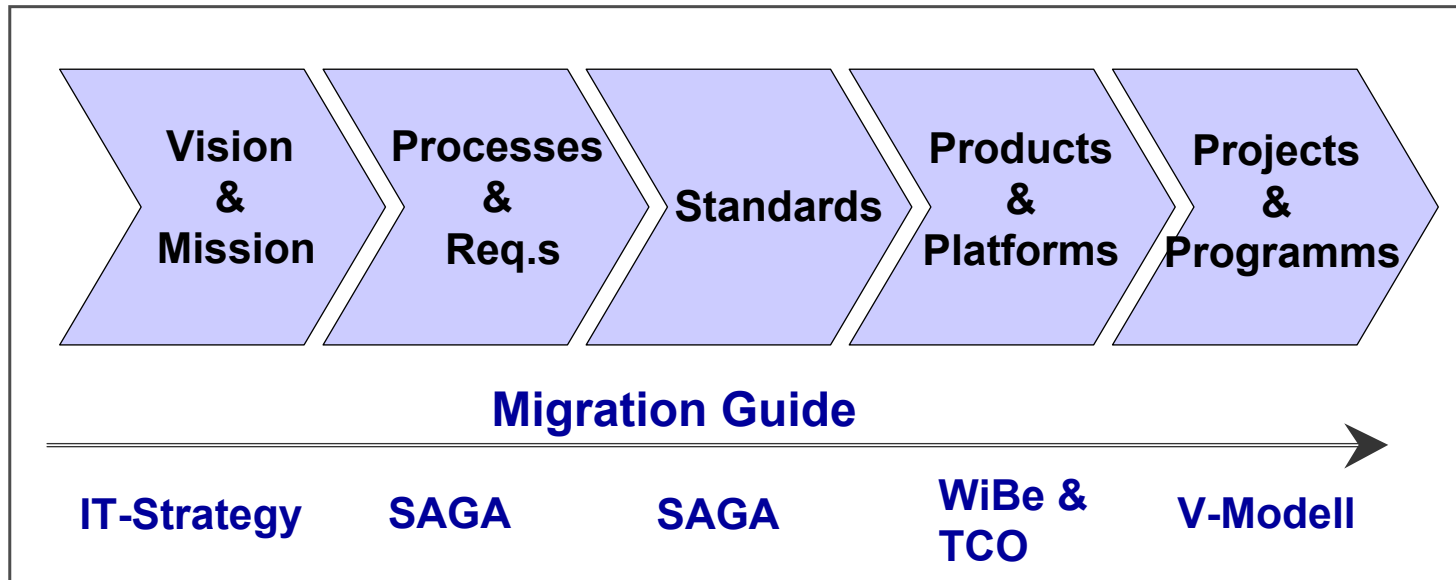

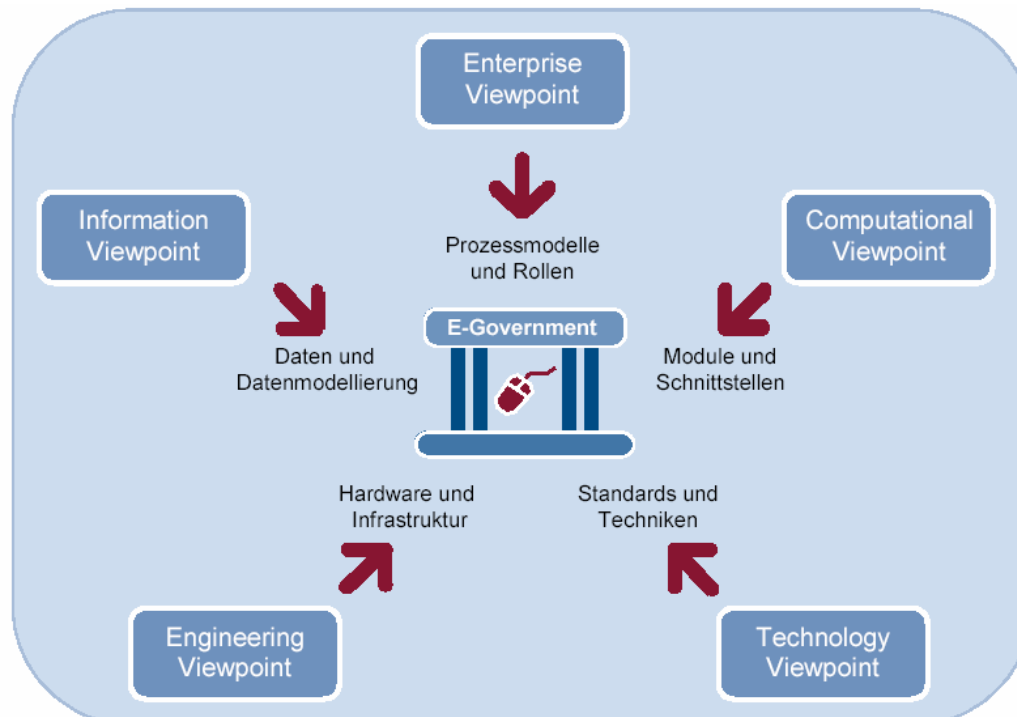


... making place for SAGA & Migration Guide



- **SAGA: Standards and Architectures for eGovernment Applications** – the first step toward common government set of IT-standards
- **Migration Guide:** a bridge connecting all singular works for IT-standards in the public sector

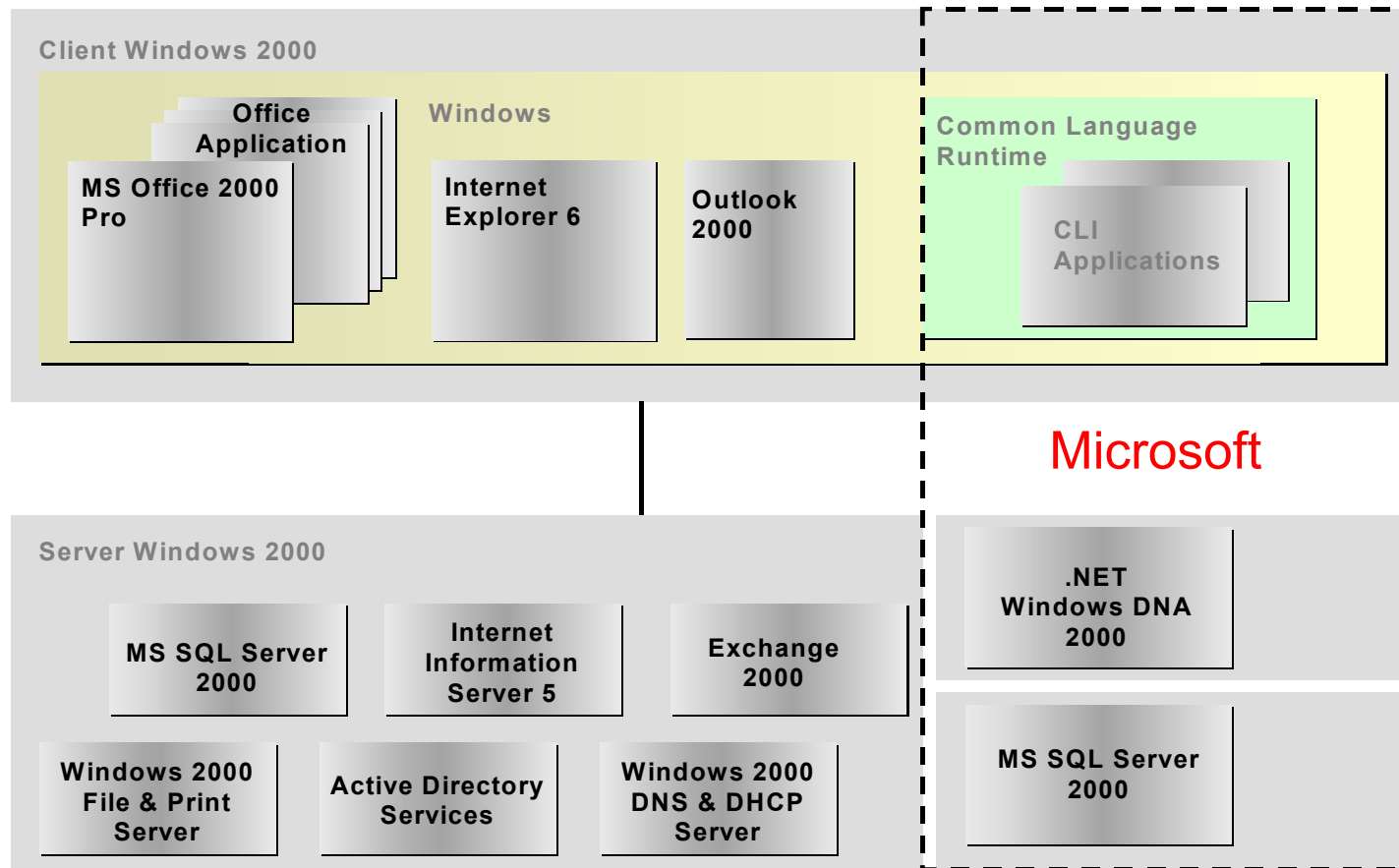
Released 2003 SAGA V2.0 defines a full-blown set of technical standards for eGovernment integrated in a framework concept





Migration Guide V1.0, Mai 2003

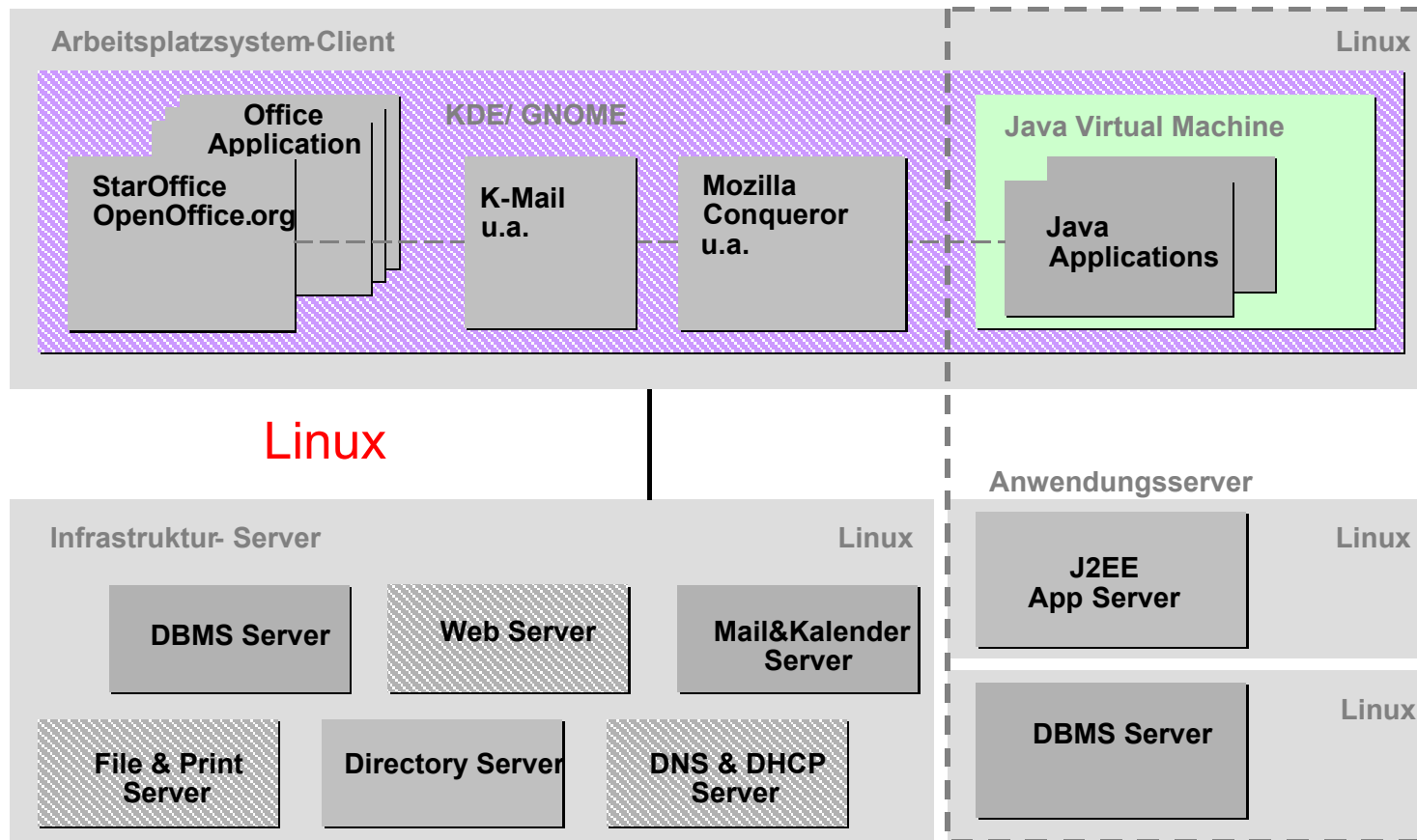
New approach: define the functionality of a standard workplace with Microsoft`s and Linux platforms ...



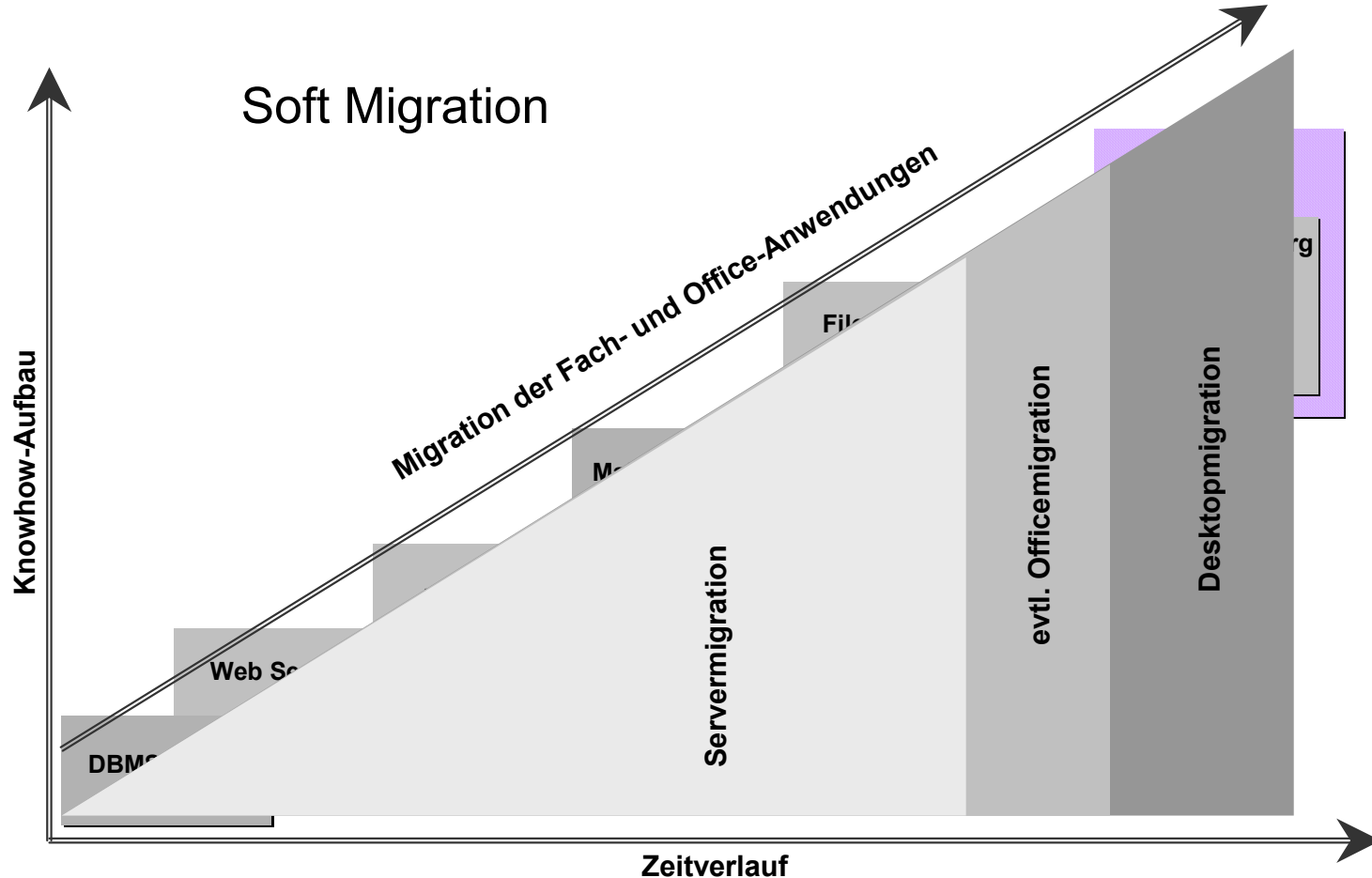


Migration Guide V1.0
